The Pericardium is intimately linked to the heart, the diaphragm, the pleuras, the trachea, the esophagus, the entry of the stomach, the principal arterial and venous tracts, the phrenic centre (responsible for the respiration), the stellar ganglion (key in the regulation of the neurovegetative nervous system), the base of the craneum, the intracranial membranes, the Tiroides and Thymus' glands; plus numerous ligaments that link it directly to the spine from the sacrum to the craneum's base.
